Community Service & Leadership Class Description & Expectations

We've got an exciting and eventful nine weeks planned in the Community Service and Leadership (CS&L) elective class! This course replaces a traditional 7th and 8th grade student council program to allow more students an opportunity to try leadership and to play an influential role in the happenings at school.

There are three main components to the community service and leadership class: leadership development, school committee work, and individual community service.

I. Leadership Development

Throughout this nine-week course we will focus on many areas of leadership, including communication, listening, team building, decision-making and conflict resolution. Students will have lessons on each of these topics and will also engage in multiple activities to allow them to practice their skills.

Students are expected to carry their leadership skills through to all of their classes at school. Twice during the quarter, teachers will evaluate the students on their leadership in all classes. These evaluations will be part of the student's CS&L grade.

II. Committee Work

At Mill Creek, the students in CS&L plan all school-wide activities, such as dances, spirit weeks, assemblies, charity fundraisers and drives, staff appreciation and students recognition events. In order to plan and carry out these activities, students will be divided into committees within the class. Each committee will have specific goals to work toward and will work together to accomplish these goals. Students will have time in class to work on their committee projects but they may need to assign themselves homework as well. Part of each student's grade is determined by how well they are on task during committee time, and how well his/her committee accomplishes its goals.

III. Individual Community Service

During this nine-week period, each student is required to complete ten (10) hours of individual community service. In general, community service should be performed for a non-profit organization or an approved organization that has demonstrated need. Other approved organizations include public schools, nursery schools, intergenerational centers, senior centers, and churches. Many times organizations will contact our program to ask for volunteers. In these cases, the advisors will announce the opportunities in class and students will just need to bring in a signed note from a parent giving permission to participate in this service opportunity.

We would like students to step out of their comfort zone to try new things. For this reason, we limit the number of service hours students can complete <u>within the school and</u> for non-profit sports teams to five (5) hours out of the required ten (10). Additionally, students <u>may not complete more than five (5) hours</u> out of the required ten (10) in any <u>one place or organization</u> unless approved prior to the service date by a class advisor. If a student chooses to perform work for a school or a sports team, they must complete at least five (5) hours for another organization.

Once a student has completed community service at a location, a Community Service Verification Form must be completed by the student. The Verification Form also needs to be filled out and signed by the supervisor of the service. A supervisor cannot be a family member for any reason. A family member cannot sign the verification form for any **reason.** We are asking students to step out of their comfort zone and experience new things. The process of how to fill out a Verification Form will be explained in class.

If you are not sure whether an activity will count as community service, **ask** one of the advisors **first**, before you plan to count it toward your hours.

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*You may **not** count hours that you are required to do for another organization (church, scouts, 4-H, etc.) as part of your 10 hours for CS&L. However, you may count them toward a Service Pin (see description below).

*No more than one hour of community service may be completed at home without prior approval by a class advisor. An example of an hour of acceptable service at home would be tying blankets at home and donating them to one of the area hospitals. In an instance like this, the Community Service Verification Form would be signed by the personnel at the hospital who received the blanket. Remember – family members may not sign a Verification Form.

Mill Creek offers a Community Service Pin program to encourage students to complete service throughout their two years at Mill Creek, and to prepare students to be lifelong service providers. Students are awarded pins and certificates for completing 25 hours, 50 hours, 75 hours, 100 hours and even 150 hours of service during their **two years** at Mill Creek. In addition, any student who completes 50 or 100 hours during a 12-month period will receive a Presidential Service Pin and Certificate from the President of the United States.
